The Cross Country Pace is a team event in which up to four riders go cross-country over and around obstacles together. The obstacles vary according to ability level and the courses are flexible to offer something for all riding abilities. There are three divisions that offer options such as optional jumping at a slow pace or a cantering pace over challenging jumps.

Unlike Grand Prix show jumping, the winner of the Cross Country Pace is not the fastest time, but rather the winning team is the team that is closest to the "paced" official time. It is a great opportunity to have some fun outdoors with horses. Prizes are awarded in all divisions. There are separate prizes for costumes, as many riders have taken this event to a whole new level with their creations for horse and rider. The costumes have become a favorite feature of the event for spectators and contestants alike. This year's pace provides riders with an opportunity to try out their Halloween attire. Vendors and caterers make the event fun for the whole family.

Riders start the course early morn, with an Arapahoe hound exhibition at noon. Every morning competitor is welcome to ride again with the hounds on course at noon in a simulated This is the hunt's largest fundraiser of the year. foxhunt. Nearly 100 English Foxhounds are fed for a year by the proceeds from this event.
